ITINERARY



Monday, September 19 United States

Depart for Venice, Italy.

Tuesday, September 20 Venice, Italy

Arrive in Venice and board the five-star MS *Le Lyrial* in the afternoon. (D)

Wednesday, September 21 Split, Croatia

Enjoy a walking tour of Split's historic city center, a UNESCO World Heritage Site built on the foundation of Roman Emperor Diocletian's retirement palace. Today, people live and work in this thriving, nearly 2000-year-old complex. Visit the Temple of Jupiter, considered one of the best-preserved Roman temples in the world, and the Cathedral of St. Domnius (A.D. 305), regarded as the world's oldest Catholic cathedral still in use in its original structure. Experience the unique vision of Ivan Mestrovic, Croatia's most accomplished sculptor, on a visit to the Mestrovic Gallery. And attend a coastal life forum, where local residents discuss contemporary life along the Adriatic.

In the evening, attend the captain's welcome reception. (B, L, R, D)

Thursday, September 22 Hvar/Korčula

Since the fourth century B.C., the Greeks, Romans, Byzantines, and Venetians have all left their mark on the island of Hvar. Old Town is filled with impressive landmarks, including the Renaissance Cathedral of St. Stephen and its four-story bell tower. Visit the Benedictine Convent, known for its unique lacemaking recognized on the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage list.

After an onboard lunch, arrive in Korčula. This charming island city retains its original 13th-century walls, within which you'll find the Abbey Treasury of the 15th-century Gothic-Renaissance Cathedral of St. Mark, home to a priceless collection of manuscripts and artwork including masterful works by Tintoretto. Onboard in the evening, enjoy a specially arranged traditional Croatian *klapa* performance of harmonized a cappella singing, also recognized by UNESCO as a significant contribution to humanity's cultural heritage. Friday, September 23 Dubrovnik

Affectionately called "the pearl of the Adriatic," the entire city of Dubrovnik is a UNESCO World Heritage site in recognition of its historic treasures and incomparable beauty. Visit the city's most famous landmarks, including the 15th-century Rector's Palace and the fascinating Maritime Museum. Walk near the well-preserved old city walls and see the Franciscan Monastery. (B, L, D)



Saturday, September 24 Kotor, Montenegro

Montenegro is one of the newest nations in the world, having gained its independence in 2006. The spectacular Bay of Kotor, deeply carved into the Montenegrin mountains, leads to the charming town of Kotor, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Enjoy a guided walking tour and time at leisure to explore its Venetian baroque Old Town and impressive medieval fortifications. (B, L, D)

Sunday, September 25 Corfu, Greece/Sarandë, Albania, for Butrint

Cruise to the Ionian island of Corfu, Greece, Homer's "beautiful and rich land," where the varying cultural influences of past rulers are reflected in the French boulevards, Georgian mansions, Venetian citadel, and Greek temple. Enjoy a walking tour of Corfu's Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site that includes the Old Fortress. See Town Hall—once a Venetian theater—built in 1663, and the Edwardian Palace of the King of Greece.

Upon arrival in the picturesque coastal city of Sarandë, Albania, travel overland to the revelatory remains of Butrint, where ancient history is displayed in its well-preserved archaeological ruins. Virgil spoke of Butrint as a *parvam Troiam* (little Troy), a stop for Aeneas and his exiled Trojans on their epic journey. Today, Butrint's ruins—a UNESCO World Heritage site—trace the rise and fall of 3000 years of ancient civilizations, from Greek and Roman to Byzantine, Venetian, and Ottoman. The Greco-Roman amphitheater highlights the city's history of rich cultural life. Its public baths, gymnasium, and aqueduct built by Emperor Augustus offer glimpses of Butrint as a Roman port, while the intricately tiled Baptistery resounds with early Christian symbolism. A short drive to 16th-century Lekursi Castle provides a stunning panoramic view of Sarandë. (B, L, D)



Monday, September 26 Itea for Delphi/Corinth Canal

Ancient Greeks of all classes flocked to the sacred ground on Mount Parnassus to consult Pythia, the high priestess of the Temple of Apollo, on matters as mundane as farming and as monumental as the declaration of war. Visit the spectacular ruins of the iconic sanctuary of Delphi, the center of the Greek world in the sixth century B.C. and a UNESCO World Heritage site today. Pass through the Sacred Way and stand at the marble Altar of the Chians, where

the common and mighty alike awaited the oracle's pronouncements. Tour the magnificent Delphi Archaeological Museum, a treasure trove of ancient artifacts including a life-size, fifth-century B.C. bronze charioteer.

Return to Itea and cruise through the Corinth Canal, first proposed at the end of the seventh century B.C. but not fully realized until a French engineering company completed it in 1893. An impressive waterway cuts through the Isthmus of Corinth; only 82 feet wide at the water's surface, it is so narrow that only small ships can make the passage.

In the evening, attend the captain's farewell reception. (B, L, R, D)

Tuesday, September 27 Athens/United States

Disembark the ship in Athens to begin the Athens post-cruise, or transfer to the airport for your return flight to the United States. (B)


